

# **The Regulations for Double Majors**

1. The regulations of double majors in the Department of Economics of National Taiwan University (hereinafter, the Department) is set up in accordance with the relevant provisions of Article 2 of the “Regulations for Double Majors of National Taiwan University.”
  
2. Students from another department who choose the Department as a double major must meet the standards set by the University (with a GPA of 2.92 or above in every semester in the previous academic year or with a grade in the top 20% of the class), and should also pass least 2 courses of the following 8 courses, with grades above B-:
  - (1) Principles of Microeconomics with Recitation and Principles of Macroeconomics with Recitation (4, 4) (including Principles of Microeconomics and Principles of Macroeconomics (3, 3));
  - (2) Microeconomics (I) & (II) (3, 3);
  - (3) Macroeconomics (I) & (II) (3, 3);
  - (4) Statistics with Recitation and Introductory Econometrics with Recitation (4, 4).The above course titles may be adjusted according to the actual course offerings.
  
3. Students who add this Department as a double major must complete the required and departmental elective courses offered by the Department. If they have passed the required courses offered in their own department that are also the required courses of the Department, the credits can be counted as the required course credits of the Department. If they have passed the required courses offered in their own department that are also the departmental elective courses of the Department, the credits can be counted up to 12 credits of the departmental elective course credits of the Department. For students who are not allowed to take the course concurrently, or those who do not have enough credits after taking the course concurrently, the Department will designate a substitute course to make up the difference in credits.

The above departmental elective courses refer to the courses whose course codes begin with ECON or the courses designated by the Department.

4. After receiving the applications for double majors of the Department, the Department Chair will convene a meeting of the “Admissions Committee” to review the applications and report the results to the University.
5. The regulations will be implemented after being approved by the Department Affairs Meeting and being reported to University. The same process applies when there is any further revision in the future.
