

Regulations of the Scholarship for Hope Admission Program

Department of Economics, National Taiwan University

Approved by the Departmental Meeting on June 17, 2021

1. In order to encourage economically disadvantaged undergraduate students of the Department of Economics of National Taiwan University to devote themselves to their studies and to strive for outstanding results, our alumni donate and establish the “Scholarship for Hope Admission Program of the Department of Economics of National Taiwan University.” The scholarship aims to help the economically disadvantaged students who enter our department through the “Hope Admission Program” complete their studies.
2. Undergraduate students who are enrolled through “Hope Admission Program” can apply for this scholarship. After reviewed by the Department Admission Committee, subsidies will be provided to those who are indeed economically disadvantaged.
3. This scholarship will be granted by the donation, until it is used up.
4. Our department will announce the period of application time in September and February in each year. Applicants should prepare and submit the following documents within the period of time to the department office:
 - (1) Application form for this scholarship program;
 - (2) Certificates of low-income or middle-low-income households, or economically disadvantaged households, issued by the county or city governments in the past three years;
 - (3) A copy of the household registration within three months (detailed household registration records are required);
 - (4) Other relevant supporting documents (such as the proofs of major family mishaps, serious illness or physical and mental disabilities, etc.).
5. After the approval, the subsidized students will be awarded scholarships based on the following principles:
 - (1) The subsidy of the scholarship is granted with a maximum of eight semesters. In case of special circumstances, it will be reviewed and decided by the Admission Committee.
 - (2) During the first academic year during the semester, a subsidy of NT\$50,000 per semester will be granted. From the second academic year to the fourth academic year, if the academic performance average (GPA) of the previous semester reaches 2.7, the student can continuously receive NT\$50,000 in the current semester.
 - (3) If the student transfers to another departments or university, drops out of school, or is expelled by the university, he or she will become disqualified and the subsidy will no longer be given. No subsidy will be granted when students are on leave.

6. This regulation will be implemented after it is approved by the Departmental Meeting, and the same procedure applies when it is revised in the future.
